

Tours at NW Meet – June 7-9, 2018 - Bring passports for stamping

Wolf Haven International - Tenino, WA - **\$9 per person**. **Friday Tour** is a 40 mile **round trip** on mostly 35 mph back roads. The Mission of Wolf Haven Int. is to conserve and protect wolves and their habitat and to provide sanctuary, offer education and promote conservation. Those touring to the Haven will choose the time for departure - 10:00 - 11:00 - 12:00 am - because staff can lead only 20 at a time through the facility. Box lunches will be provided or there is a 50's era dinner called Scotty B's 3 miles from WHI. If you like the drive but do not want to go through the Wolf Haven you can still go there, eat your box lunch where there are picnic tables and rest rooms. Morton, WA - **Friday Tour** – Vintage Railroad and lumber town – An easy ride through beautiful scenery, water, trees and mountains. Morton was a town of rugged men in tin hats and hickory shirts. Women...well, they were sparse – this was bachelor territory where young men came to make money cutting timber. Approximately 40 miles from Chehalis – Stop at city park to eat box lunches. **Jon Schmidt, Tour master - 80 miles r/t**

Dick Busek Collection - **\$5 per person** – **Thursday and Friday** groups. You won't find another place (3 bldgs.) where you will see as many rare vehicles, unusual old enamel signs and unrestored items as in this location. Be prepared to turn sideways to get through the aisles. In Galvin, 2 miles west of **I-5 and Exit 81** - 172 Union Ave., Centralia, WA. 12 miles r/t – **David Gowan, Tour master**

Ft. Borst Stockade and Park - Though never actually used for the protection of pioneers, it was used for the storage of grain brought down the Chehalis River by Indians in dugout canoes. The blockhouse was built 100 yards from any object, so Indians would have to cross a large open space to reach it. Close examination of the exterior walls of the fort will reveal bullet holes-- the result of target practice. **Exit 79 from I-5** then to west side of freeway in Centralia, WA - 8 miles r/t – **Self Directed**

Veteran's Museum - \$5, \$4 Seniors – See a 30' X 60' - flag from USS Abraham Lincoln – Medals of Honor - Artifacts from Revolutionary War to present – Weapons, Photographs – Equipment – Uniforms – Original Letters – Medals - Memorabilia – Vehicles – **Hours 10 am to 5 pm – I-5 at Exit 77** 100 SW Veteran's way – Chehalis, WA – **Self Directed**
